Fortunately, awareness is growing of the challenges that residents face when they are expecting or have just welcomed a new baby. Along those lines, **Dr. Erika Rangel** (our 2022 MSS Grand Rounds speaker) and colleagues recently published a Viewpoint in JAMA Surgery detailing how surgery training programs can better support trainees with new children. An excerpt is below:


Training programs should actively seek feedback from participating residents to optimize support and benchmark improvements in resident well-being. Non-birthing resident parents face unique stressors related to professional and family balance (eg, gender stereotypes that undervalue their need to bond with a new child), and similar mentorship programs may be created to support their needs. Modern surgical training should promote healthy pregnancies and endorse family needs through structured support during a time of significant personal and professional transition.

In partnership with Drs. Varma and Kornblith and MSS, Dr. Vu and Dr. Colley are working on a comprehensive **new resident parent support program**. As part of this program, we are looking for faculty who are parents and who would like to mentor a trainee or junior faculty member who is also a new parent. Join us on Zoom (details to follow) for an informative and interactive event designed to help residents and junior faculty understand how to navigate balancing clinical and research time.




