Tips for Surgery Residency Program Interviews

Here are some highlights from the session that are generally applicable to other surgical subspecialties!



From the MSS Residency Prep Panels



- Look at interview dates posted on residency program websites for planning purposes
- All programs will send invitations from 10/26-10/31 for first-round offers
- Think of interviews as an opportunity to be authentic and share what makes you you
- Make sure your technology and wifi connection work
- Have a nice Zoom background
- Refresh your CV and be prepared to discuss it

- Ask insightful and sincere questions that show you have thought about the program
- Classic interview questions:
 - Talk about the greatest challenge you've overcome
 - What are you most proud of?
 - Why did you go into surgery?
 - Where do you see yourself in 10-15 years?
- Show gratitude to all personnel organizing the interview day
- Be engaged and be enthusiastic!
