New Spotlight:



Dr. M. Margaret "Peggy" Knudson, MD, FACS



Dr. M. Margaret "Peggy" Knudson was recently interviewed by medical student Rachel Huynh about her surgical journey, advice for other female surgeons, and her inspirations.

Dr. Knudson has had a high-impact career with notable positions as Professor of Surgery at UCSF and Chief of Surgery at the San Francisco General Hospital. As an academic trauma surgeon, she has been on the front lines of treating trauma vitctims in major disasters including the 2010 Haitian earthquake and the crash of Asiana Airlines Flight 214. She worked closely with the military to treat battlewounded service members during the Iraq and Afghanistan War. Outside of her successful medical career, Dr. Knudson is a mother to twin daughters and is an avid cyclist.

Although women have made up half of medical students since 2003, gender-based workplace discrimination and harassment for physicians continues. The increasing diversity within surgical professional spaces requires new definitions of professionalism.

As told through interviews, 1001 Cuts uses personal narratives to **highlight issues specific to women surgeons** while underscoring themes common to the #MeToo movement.
