Dr. Grace Banik is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Otolaryngology at UCSF. She completed a fellowship in Pediatric Otolaryngology at the Children’s Hospital of Philadelphia. She is especially interested in cancerous and noncancerous head and neck growths, including pediatric thyroid cancer.

Congratulations to our MSS Members in the 2024 Class of John A. Watson Faculty Scholars and Recipients of the Dean's Diversity Fund Awards!

The UCSF School of Medicine Dean's Diversity Fund was established in 2015 to support the recruitment and retention of faculty who share the university's commitment to diversity and the belief that we have the responsibility to care for culturally diverse and medically underserved populations. The awards provide faculty with three-year, \$75,000 per year support to develop their academic interests, as well as pursue activities that contribute to the community.



Caitlin Collins, MD, MPH
Assistant Professor, Surgery

A Surgical Critical Care Fellow, Dr. Collins completed her General Surgery residency training at UCSF in 2022. Her research has focused on alternative payment models, health equity, and quality improvement within surgical populations. Under the mentorship of Dr. Liza Wick, she has explored the impact of bundled payment reimbursement models within a general surgery population. She has also worked on the implementation of a quality improvement platform for trauma patients in Southwestern Cameroon under the guidance and mentorship of Dr. Catherine Juillard and Dr. Alain Chichom Mefire.

Daisy Leon-Martinez, MD, MAS
Assistant Professor, Obstetrics,
Gynecology & Reproductive Sciences

A perinatologist, Dr. Leon-Martinez is a specialist providing care when pregnant people and developing fetuses have conditions requiring expert management. She also works in labor and delivery and cares for pregnant people who require hospitalization. In her research, Dr. Leon-Martinez seeks to understand how maternal conditions, such as diabetes, infections and autoimmune diseases, can affect the placenta's development. She also studies disorders that arise from high blood pressure during pregnancy, such as preeclampsia, and has a special interest in interventions to reduce disparities in health around the time of childbirth due to preeclampsia.

Rita Mukhtar, MD
Associate Professor,
Department of Surgery

Dr. Rita Mukhtar specializes in breast surgery and general surgery for urgent conditions. Dr. Mukhtar conducts research on breast cancer genetics and risk reduction. She also specifically studies lobular breast cancer and ductal carcinoma in situ.



Dr. Jolie L. Chang is an otolaryngologist who specializes in surgery to treat obstructive sleep apnea. She serves as chief of the UCSF Division of Sleep Surgery. Dr. Chang's research interests include decision making in health care and improvements for sleep apnea therapy and sialendoscopy.

She has written on topics related to hearing loss, salivary obstruction symptoms and treatment, otolaryngology resident perspectives, and smell and taste changes related to COVID-19. She serves as the director of resident research for otolaryngology – head and neck surgery.





Congratulations to Dr. Hannah Decker and Dr. Marissa Boeck on their ZSFGH Highlight!


Over the past two years as a UCSF surgery resident, Dr. Decker has been working to improve health outcomes for patients who have surgical problems and who are experiencing homelessness. Through her clinical care and research, she identified that appointment scheduling is a significant barrier for patients to receive surgery and follow-up care. To gain more insight from on how to improve the delivery of care to patients experiencing homelessness, Dr. Decker connected with Dr. Barry Zevin, Medical Director of the DPH's Whole Person Integrated Care (WPIC) program. This led to a collaboration between WPIC'S nurses, social workers, street care teams, and clinicians from ZSFG's surgery department to develop a drop-in clinic model for surgery, with a pilot of this program starting later this summer. As part of this team, Dr. Marissa Boeck, assistant professor of surgery, has worked with to increase awareness of WPIC resources and the street medicine team in order to ensure patients receive appropriate peri-operative care.



Congratulations to Dr. Merisa Piper, the New Associate Program Director of Assessment and Wellness!




As Medical Director for cancer reconstruction at Mission Bay, Dr. Piper leads initiatives on Quality Improvement, Enhanced Recovery After Surgery (ERAS), and Operating Room scheduling. Her research, centered on breast reconstruction and including a groundbreaking clinical trial on mastectomy patients' microbiome, underscores her commitment to advancing patient care. Dr. Piper is also a respected reviewer for numerous journals, serving as Breast Section Editor for the Annals of Plastic Surgery, and holds key roles in national and regional plastic surgery organizations such as the American Society of Plastic Surgery, the American Society of Reconstructive Microsurgery, the American Council of Academic Plastic Surgeons, and the California Society of Plastic Surgery. She is deeply dedicated to resident education and well-being and her appointment reflects her exemplary dedication to clinical excellence, research innovation, and nurturing the next generation of plastic surgeons.
