

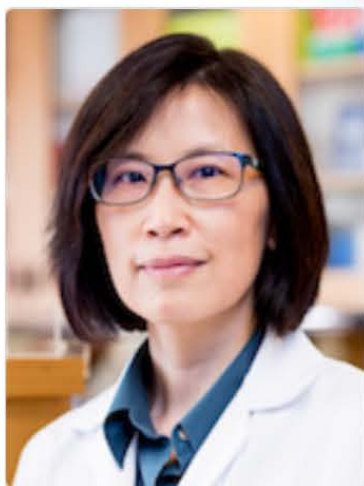

Exploring Parenthood and Career Choices among Women Physicians

Published in JAMA Surgery, this thought-provoking survey study authored by Bakkensen et al. delves into the intricate balance between pursuing a medical career and the decision to start a family. Bakkensen and their colleagues shed light on the challenges faced by women in medicine, revealing that despite being well-informed about age-related fertility decline, a significant three-fourths of respondents chose to delay childbearing. More than one-third of participants also experienced infertility. These findings underline the tough choices women physicians encounter and the potential impact on their career trajectories.

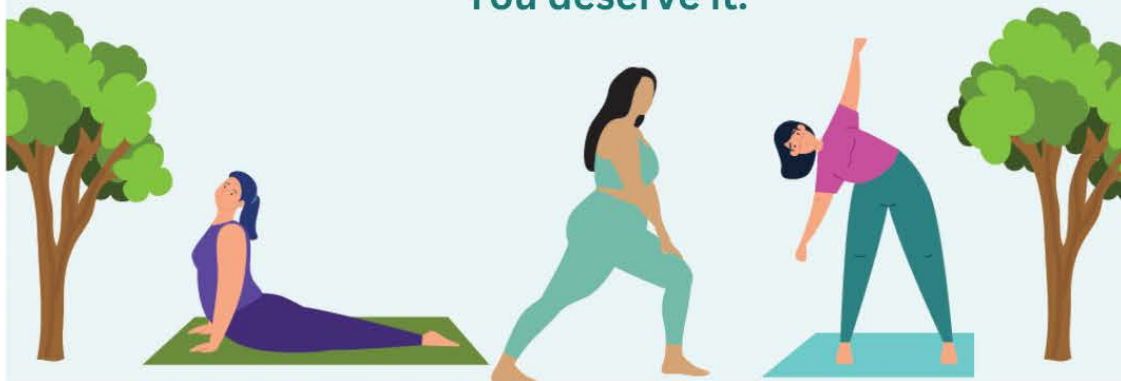
