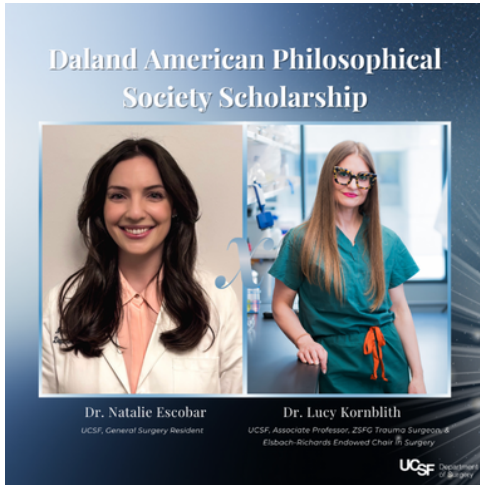

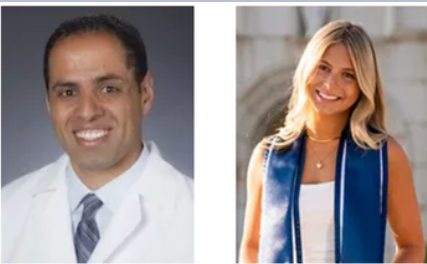

"Experiences like this are a tremendous help to first-year medical students (including me) as they explore and refine their interests and start to develop an idea of what kind of physician they want to become."



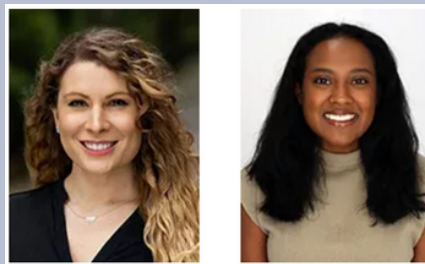
