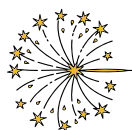

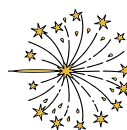

BREAST SURGERY SPOTLIGHT



We are proud to spotlight recent recognitions that underscore the innovation, mentorship, and dedication of our Breast Surgery faculty.

Dr. Cheryl Ewing has received the **UCSF PISCES Teaching Award**, honoring her excellence in clinical teaching and mentorship. Students praised her for outstanding instruction in breast cancer care and essential surgical skills, as well as her deep commitment to supporting learners' growth and career development. This well-deserved recognition reflects her dedication to educating the next generation of physicians.



Dr. Rita Mukhtar and **Dr. Elisabeth Abeles** have been awarded a \$50,000 Research Development Grant through the UCSF Breast Oncology Program for their pilot study evaluating FAP PET imaging to track disease progression in metastatic invasive lobular carcinoma. Their work is part of the multicenter PLUMB study and has the potential to improve diagnostic accuracy and patient care for a challenging breast cancer subtype.

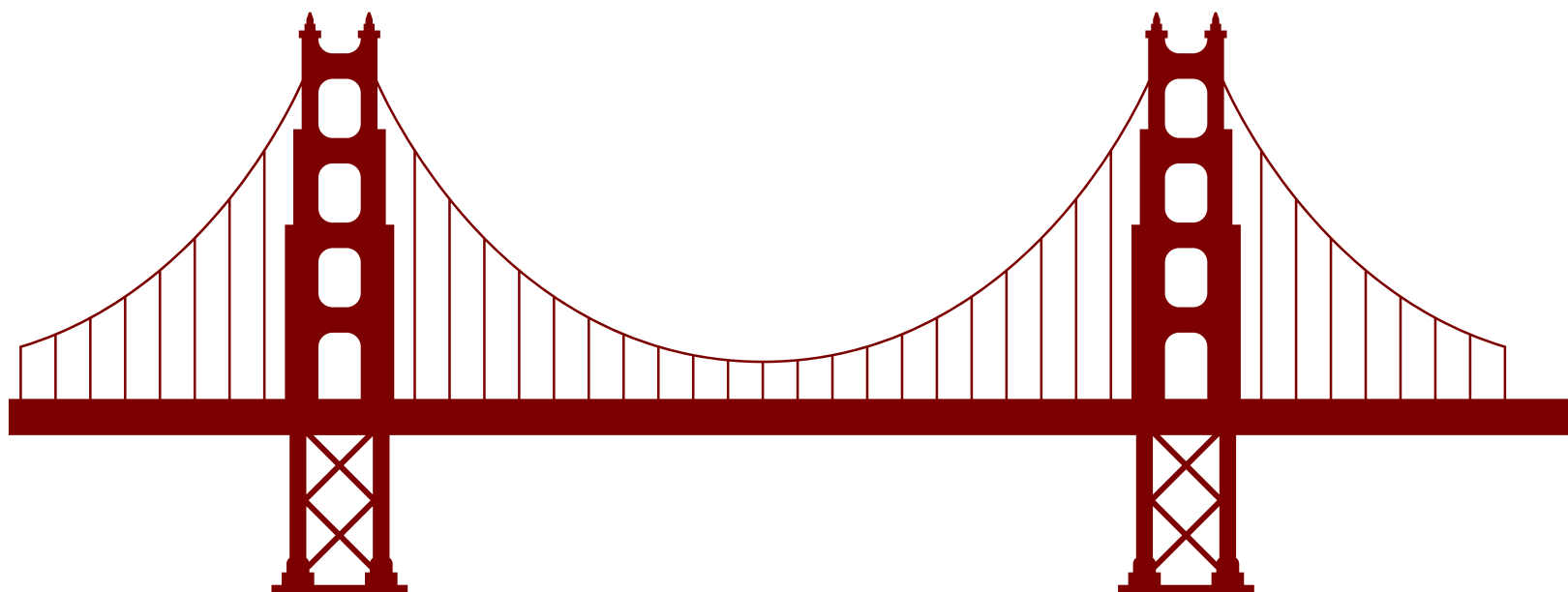
