National Doctor's Day

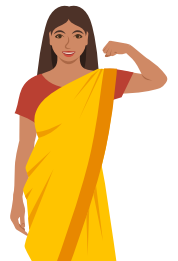

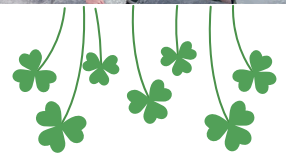

Below is an excerpt from her spotlight, conducted by medical student Saffanat Sumra that is **coming soon to the MSS website!**

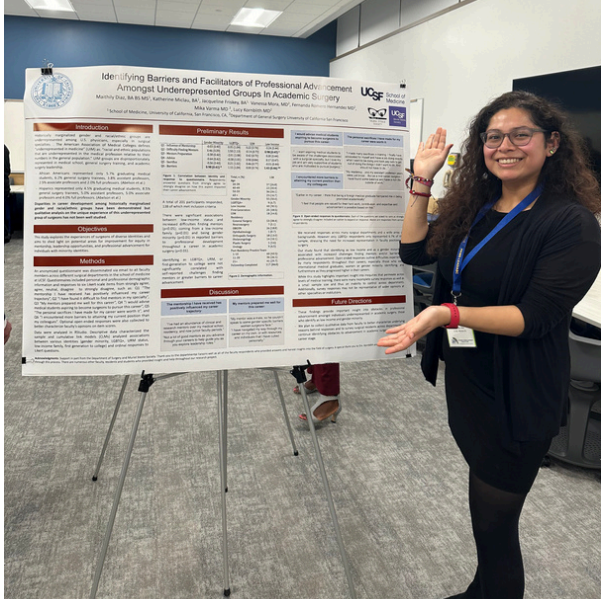
Is there a quote, mantra, or some lesson that you live by?
